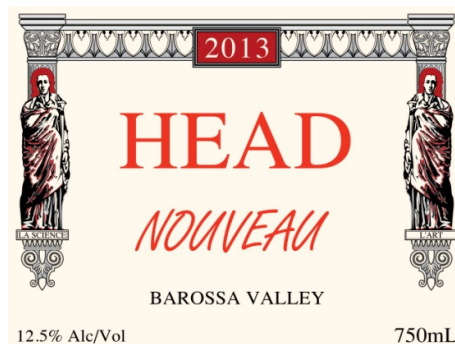

2013 HEAD 'NOUVEAU' Touriga/Montepulciano/Grenache Barossa Valley



In homage to the great 'easy-drinking' Beaujolais wine styles of France comes a brand new venture for HEAD Wines. The 2013 'NOUVEAU' represents new ideas about sustainability and drinkability of wine styles in the Barossa Valley.

It is no secret that Alex Head has a love of balance and drinkability in his wines. Taking new winemaking lessons from Beaujolais and combining them with Barossa flavour and character have produced a tasty, light, easy drinking wine for the warmer months of the year. Combining; 50% Touriga Nacional (Portugese) with its low alcohol, rose petal aromatics and bright purple colours, 40% Montepulciano (Italian) for lighter body, cherry flavours and fresh quenching tannins and finally 10% Grenache for sweet fruit. No oak was harmed in the making of this wine. Bottled with low sulphur in a light-weight bottle under stelvin capsule.

A blend of 50% Touriga, Montepulciano and dash of Grenache. Onya Heady! Violet perfume, gravel and meat and metal sparking, blue fruits. It's crisp and fresh and brimming with life – tangy black and blue fruit, lightly tannic, meaty and dry, yet sufficiently fruity with a bright yet meaty finish. The perfect mid-week, food-friendly, bistro-centric, drinking wine. Mike Bennie might call it a 'vin de soif'. I just call it 'bloody tasty'. Recommended with no reservations.
